

SPORTS AT THE COLLEGES

PROBABLE MAKE-UP OF THE TRACK AND FIELD TEAMS.

The City College Athletic Association Preparing for the Annual Spring Games—Events and the Entries—The University of Pennsylvania and Cornell Decide to Go to Minneapolis for Their 'Varsity Race—Football Players at Princeton Will Compete for a Cup.

The nineteenth annual Spring games of the College of the City of New-York Athletic Association will be held at Manhattan Field on Friday, May 5, at 2 P. M. The events will be as follows: 100-yard dash, 220-yard dash, 440-yard dash, 800-yard run, one-mile run, three-mile run, two-mile (safety) bicycle, 220-yard hurdle, high jump, broad jump, and pole vault.

As an incentive to the students, the committee will offer to send all men to the intercollegiate games who reach the following standards: 0:11 in the 100-yard event, 0:24 in 220-yard, 0:58 in 440-yard, 2:05 in 800-yard, 5:00 in the one-mile, 0:28 in the 220-yard hurdle, 5 feet 2 inches in the high jump, and 18 feet in the broad jump. The games will be more interesting than usual from almost every point of view, chiefly because the scratch men in nearly all the events will have had the best of indoor training, and the result of this new feature will be closely watched by all the students with great interest. The intercollegiate team has the privilege of training, when the weather permits, on Manhattan Field, with services and advice of Physical Director G. W. Banning and Trainer "Jim" Robinson, from April 17 to May 17, and also on the Star Athletic Club's grounds from April 19 to May 5, under Trainer Kiernan.

The college will send T. M. Donohue, '94, as its representative to the Spring games of Company C, Twenty-third Regiment, at Stamford. He will compete in the 70-yard dash, 200-yard hurdle race, and the quarter-mile run.
